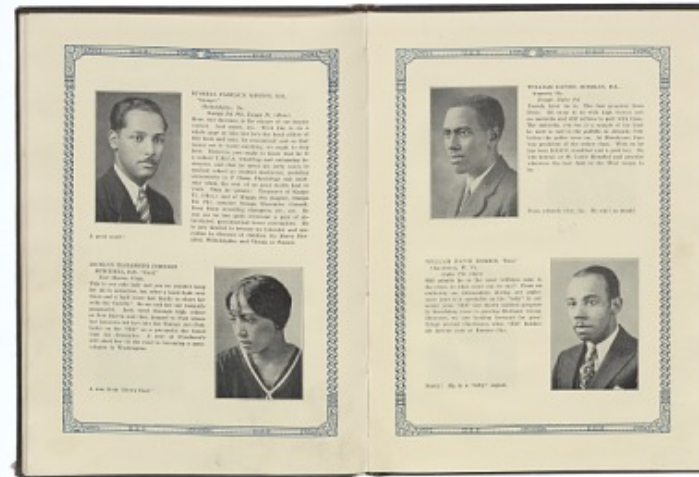
A rose from "Down East."
