From 2 batches of Apanteles (White) cocoons found beside dead aurinia larvae in marsh - specimens of Ap. melitaeorum Wilkinson emerged from 23.5.1934 onwards : examined by D.W. Wilkinson in Oct 1936 & made co-types of his n. sp. A.W.S. 24.1036.

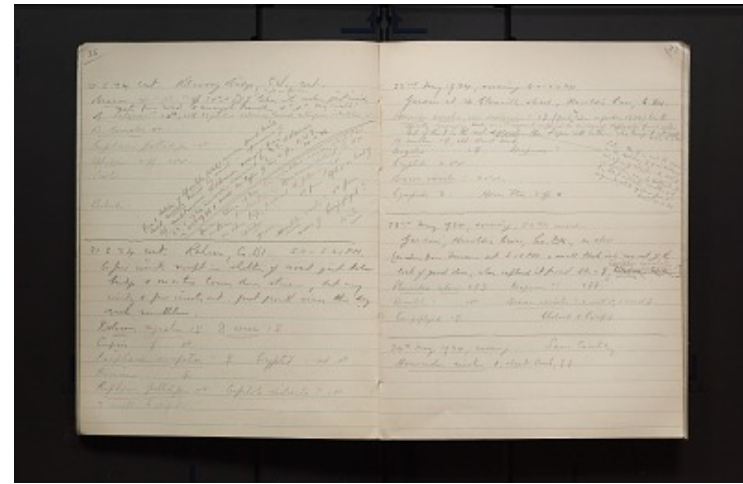
