Dear General Storrs,


You will probably remember that the last time I had the pleasure of seeing you at the auction rooms of Christie's the day of the sale of the famous Portland Vase, I told you that I may take a trip to Egypt and you told me then not to fail to let you know if ever I planned coming to Egypt.

Now I want to tell you that I am leaving New York on the "Laurentic" on the 9th of January on a cruise, stopping off at Constantinople[[sic]], Athens, Haifa, and Alexandria, and we plan to spend some time in Egypt, from the 2nd of February until about the 8th and I hope there will be an opportunity of seeing you then.
