Dear Hal,

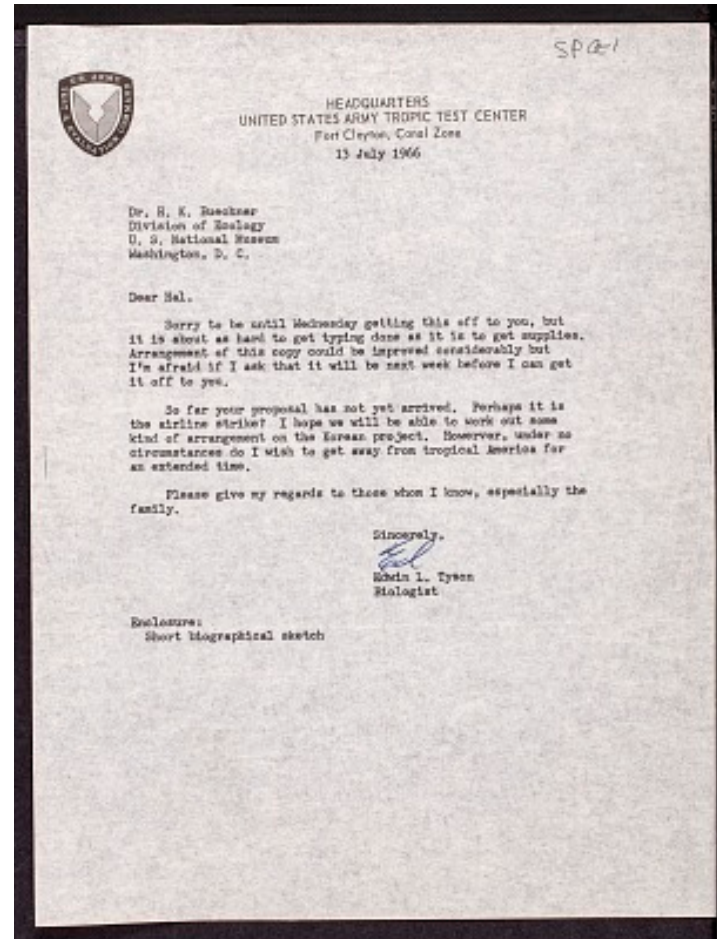
