[[/wavy-underlined]] - Most of the larger birds in the mounted collection have been transferred to new walnut stands, of the adopted model; but there still remains a considerable number, and much the greater part of the smaller specimens, which are yet on the old stands or on rough ones improvised for temporary use by the taxidermist. A sufficient number of new stands is on hand for the specimens which are yet to be transferred, and I would respectfully recommend that the completion of the work be assigned to some competent person, under the direction and supervision of the curator.

[[/wavy-underlined]] - The laboratory of the taxidermist is at present in need of many repairs and fixtures for facilitating the work of mounting birds for the exhibition series. Wall-cases with sash-doors and shelves are needed, as are also other improvements which it is unnecessary to specify here.
